## **What is Animal Science?**

Animal Science is described as "studying the biology of animals that are under the control of mankind". Historically, the degree was called animal husbandry and the animals studied were livestock species, like cattle, sheep, pigs, poultry, and horses. Most careers in Animal Science are not in the Production Sector, but in related fields such as sales and service, biotechnology, agriscience, and agribusiness.

The Animal Science Program prepares students for career opportunities and/or a college degree in the Animal Science and Vet Tech fields. Students will learn about the anatomy and physiology of large and small animals, nutrition, safety and handling, livestock production, agribusiness management and much more. The program offers two pathways for success.
