What is Early Childhood Education ?

The main focus of the Early Childhood Education Program is the education of young children.

The program teaches students about the development of children from infancy to nine years of age. This program provides a foundation for those students who are interested in working with young children.

The program teaches the physical, social, emotional, and cognitive development of children. Studies include using observation as a tool for assessment, the development of student management techniques, handling daily routines, and setting classroom limits. High school students learn how to prepare lesson plans and structure the environment to optimize student learning. Particular attention is placed on managing a budget to purchase educational materials that are safe and effective.

Early Childhood students participate in two internships throughout the school year. Students work with three-four year old children in a childcare center environment along with Pre-K and Kindergarten students in a public school setting. These students become an integral part of the classroom and work closely with teachers, support staff, and the children in everyday activities.
